The Cost of Discipleship

Luke 9:57-62

1. Last Sunday, we learned about the value of holding opinions, beliefs, and convictions in their proper place for the sake of unity. Over the past week, how have you sought to be a unifying member of the body of Christ by putting what you care about in its' proper place?
2. Pastor Brad taught us about three conversations that Jesus had with others. Read Luke 9:57-58 for the first conversation. By revealing that He has nowhere to lay his head, what is Jesus saying about the cost of discipleship to Him?
3. It is easy to make comfort and security our aim in life. How does making those values our aim run contrary to following Christ, and what are some ways you can seek discipleship to Jesus over comfort and security?
4. Brad discussed our priorities in life and where they land in our discipleship to Jesus. Take a moment to write down the top 5 priorities in your life. What would it look like to become like Christ in each of those five priorities?
5. Read Luke 9:59-62. In these two conversations, what is Jesus revealing about the cost of following Him?
6. The cost of discipleship to Christ is valuing Him above anything else. What areas of your life often come before following Christ, and how can you take steps this week to place Christ above all?
