In the Steps of Paul

Greece Trip Itinerary | May 7 -17, 2025

Come join us as we trace Paul's second missionary journey, Acts 16 - 19, through Greece and Turkey. We start with a four-day cruise on the Aegean Sea to visit Ephesus, Patmos, Mykonos, Santorini, and Crete. Then we'll fly to Thessaloniki in northern Greece to visit Amphipolis, Philippi, and Kavala. On our way back to Athens we will visit Pella, Berea, Vergina, Meterora, and Delphi. From Athens we will venture to Corinth and Nauplia. You will gain deeper insights into the Book of Acts, the Epistles of Paul, and the challenges of spreading the Gospel to the Greek world.

DAY 1 USA · ATHENS

Depart on our flight to Athens. Meals included in flight. After arriving at our hotel we will enjoy dinner together.

DAY 2 ATHENS

Enjoy a city tour of Athens. First, visit the Acropolis and wander through the ruins of some of the most architecturally perfect buildings ever constructed. We'll see the Propylaea, the Temple of the Wingless Victory, the Erechtheum with its peerless Porch of Maidens, the Parthenon and Mars Hill where Paul was brought before the council. On a drive through the city we'll see the National Library, the University, the Academy, the Presidential Palace, the Stadium, Temple of Zeus and Hadrian's Arch. The rest of the day is free to pack and prepare for our 3-night Aegean cruise.

DAY 3 ATHENS · MYKONOS

This morning, we drive to the port at Piraeus and embark on our cruise through the Aegean to Turkey. Arrive at Mykonos in the afternoon. The afternoon is at leisure on this small and famous gleaming white Aegean Island, with its golden beaches, windmills and picturesque narrow roads. All meals on board our cruise ship.

DAY 4 KUSADASI (EPHESUS) • PATMOS

This morning, we wake up and find we have arrived in Kusadasi, Turkey. Kusadasi is a colorful harbor town and the starting point for an excursion to the ancient Greek city of Ephesus, site of one of the Seven Churches of Revelation. Excavation still continues in this once great and important city, which was founded in the 10th century BC and was subdued by both Croesus and Alexander the Great. Walk through history along streets lined with magnificent public buildings, among them the Baths of Skolasticia, the Library of Celsus, the Temple of Hadrian and the theatre. Ephesus also played an important part in the life of the Apostle Paul, who wrote an epistle to its inhabitants. This afternoon, we spend our time cruising the beautiful, blue Aegean arriving after lunch in Patmos. Patmos is the beautiful, rocky island where the exiled St. John the Divine received the mystical Revelation which forms the last book of the New Testament. We will take an excursion to the Grotto of the Revelation and then go to the 11th Century Monastery of St. John, which houses an original manuscript of the Gospel. Enjoy the panoramic view from this superb, fortress-like complex, high on a hill.

DAY 5 CRETE, SANTORINI

We will wake up at Heraklion, Crete, the home of the great Minoan Civilization. Visit the Knossos excavations dating back to 4000 B.C. and the Palace. Return to our cruise ship to sail to Santorini. Enjoy the town at leisure or perhaps relax over a coffee as you gaze down upon Kamenes, the two black volcanic islets in the Caldera Bay. Afterwards, return to the small pier of Scala by cable car, where the vessel's tenders will take you back to the ship. Overnight on board our cruise ship.

DAY 6 ATHENS (Disembark) • THESSALONIKI

We will disembark the ship in Piraeus, then connect with our domestic flight to Thessaloniki for dinner and overnight.

DAY 7 THESSALONIKI • AMPHIPOLIS • PHILIPPI • KAVALA

We begin with a tour of the biblical Thessaloniki where Paul founded the Church in AD 49-50. We will see the ancient ruins as well as some local churches. "And from there we went to Philippi which is the leading city of the district of Macedonia..." (Acts 16: 12-18). Drive along the ancient route of Paul, through mountain passes and plains to Amphipolis for a short stop to view the ancient Lion Statue. Continue to Ancient Philippi where we find two early Christian basilicas, traces of the Egnatian Way which Paul followed from the harbor of Neapolis (ancient port of Philippi) on his first visit on European soil. View the Roman Forum, the Citadel, and the ancient theater. Continue on a short drive to Kavala on the site of ancient Neapolis where Paul landed on the way to Philippi. Return to Thessaloniki for dinner and overnight.

DAY 8 THESSALONIKI • PELLA • BEREA • VERGINA

We'll drive to Berea to visit a beautiful monument dedicated to Paul at Berea. Paul and Silas were sent to Berea after fleeing from Thessalonica (Acts 17:10). We visit Vergina to see the Tumulus (tomb) of Philip II as well as some of the treasures buried with him. We continue on to Meteora. Dinner & overnight in Kalambaka.

DAY 9 METEORA · DELPHI · ATHENS

Start the day with a tour of the Grand Monastery of Meteora. We proceed south to Delphi. We will take a walking tour of Apollo's sanctuary that houses the Temple of Apollo and the renowned oracle who advised both king and commoner. Tour the Theater and the Stadium where festivals and games were held. We will also visit the museum that contains exquisite pieces of sculpture among which is the Bronze Charioteer. Later today, we drive to Athens via Arachova, Levadia and Thebes. Dinner & overnight in Athens.

DAY 10 CORINTH • NAUPLIA

Today we head to Corinth driving through Daphni and Eleusis. After crossing the Corinthian Canal which connects the Aegean and Ionian Seas, we will arrive in ancient Corinth. We visit the ruins of Corinth where Paul worked with Aquila and Priscilla. Included are the First Century shops, the Agora, Temple of Apollo and the Bema Seat. Still gurgling under the ruins is the water of the springs of the mighty Acropolis above, which once fed the Fountain of Pirene. Continue your drive up to Acrocorinth, in Paul's time site of the great Temple of Aphrodite. Return to Athens where the rest of the afternoon is at leisure. We will enjoy a Greek dinner experience as our final evening of our adventure. OPA!

DAY 11 ATHENS · USA

We transfer to the airport for departure from Athens. Arrive today with wonderful memories of a magnificent journey.
