Genesis 4-11; Romans 1:18-25

- 1. In light of all that God has done for you and how God created you, how have you responded by seeking to become more like Christ in all of life this week?
- 2. As a group, read Genesis 4. Lamech's words in Genesis 4:23-24 make known to all how he will rule. What is the point here that Lamech is trying to make? How does this reflect on humanity?
- 3. Lamech says he will decimate all who oppose him. He will live how he chooses to live, and no one will rule him. In Genesis 6:6, we read that this wickedness causes God much grief (deep unfulfilled longing). Why was God grieved?
- 4. Read Genesis 6:11-13. This is the story of God's judgement. What is God telling Noah in this statement at the end of Genesis 6:13?
- 5. God will use the flood to destroy the destruction. In Genesis 8:21, after the waters recede, Noah makes a sacrifice, and God makes a covenant. Within this covenant, God sets up the institution of government. As a group, talk about this institution of government and why it was necessary.
- 6. Genesis 4-11 is all about the brokenness of humankind and that the only way for you to rule over sin is to surrender to the power of God. What will you surrender to God this week so that sin does not rule over you?
